Competition Code of Conduct

The following Code of conduct is for all members of Wauchope-Bonny Hills SLSC attending competitions representing our club.

General

- All members are to adhere to the SLSA Member Protection Policy and this Code of Conduct
- This document must be signed before attending competition
- Members under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian co-sign this document
- All monies must be paid prior to attending competition unless prior arrangement made with the management committee.

Dress

- All members attending competition must wear the official team uniform whilst on the beach
- WBHSLSC swimming costumes and competition cap must be worn by all competitors in their respective events.

Accommodation

- All bills must be settled privately with the accommodation providers, with any damage, breakages or loss to be paid for by all occupants of the room.

Personal Behaviour

- No illicit substances (prohibited or performance enhancing drugs) will be tolerated
- Under age drinking will not be tolerated (legal age 18 years with identification)
- Physical violence, harassment of any nature or inappropriate behaviour towards any team member, competitor, official, spectator or other will not be tolerated and dealt with severely
- As a Wauchope-Bonny Hills SLSC representative behaviour at all times is to be exemplary.

Competition

- Any grievances, disputes, queries etc will be handled by the appropriate SLSA Championship committee and or senior club representative (team captain or team manager)
- Officials, judges, and administration staff are to be treated fairly and with respect at all times.

Disputes/Disciplinary

- Members may be immediately banned from participating in competition as a result of breaches
- The club judiciary will deal with any serious breaches of this code of conduct
- Issues of a more urgent nature to be dealt with by a committee formed at the Competition consisting of senior club members
- Any serious matters will be referred to the SLSA Disciplinary Committee or if warrants the Police Service.
